It started about 10 years ago...

- Linked data started exploding as a topic at library conferences
- Data that was also machine-readable
- Excitement was in the air about the possibility of breaking our databases (catalog, repositories) out of their library-based silos



If you learn it, will they build it?

- Libraries bought ILS vendors' (often pricey) packages offering to convert MARC records to linked data, but results seemed underwhelming
- Many of us channeled our motivation into learning linked data concepts: RDF, Triples, SPARQL
- However, technical infrastructure and abundance of human resources not available to "use it" in most libraries



Aimed at the Perplexed Librarian

"Yet despite this activity, linked data has become something of a punchline in the GLAM community. For some, linked data is one of this era's hottest technology buzzwords; but others see it as vaporware, a much-hyped project that will ultimately never come to fruition. The former may be true, but the latter certainly is not."

What does it have to offer?

- Stability: Created in 2012 as part of the Wikimedia Foundation
- 2014: Google retired Freebase in favor of Wikidata
- Ready-made infrastructure (Wikibase) & ontology
- Shared values of knowledge creation
- Easy to use graphical interface
- Hub of identifiers



If they build it, you can learn...

 Is not a matter of building something and hoping the search engines will find it: Wikidata IS used by Google and other agents (Siri, etc.)

You can create infoboxes on Wikipedia that pulls from

Wikidata





Not that there aren't challenges!

- Still a learning curve, particularly the deeper you dive
- Difficulty in measuring impact
- Cultural differences between two communities
 - Records/items can be proposed for deletion
 - Anyone can edit (including bots)...

Goals of PCC

- Comparing ease of use and benefits of Wikidata to other registries (LCNAF, ISNI)
- Assessing the productivity and quality assurance tools that exist (or should exist)
- Learning about the culture of the Wikidata community

Benefits to our library

- Gain familiarity of working within linked data platform (Wikidata)
- Apply linked data knowledge gained over the past years
- Bring more visibility to affiliated persons, organizations, collections, and projects within our university



Initial Setup

- Recruited people to work on new project (or people proposed new projects!)
- Gave introductory presentation about Wikidata
 - Also demonstrated the creation of a Wikidata record during presentation

Four projects at Texas State University

- Wikidata pages for current faculty
- University Archives Oral History Collections
- Wittliff Archives Collections
- Digital Collections Journal Project



Faculty authority work

- Moving much of traditional catalog authority work from a MARC silo to Wikidata
- Creating/enhancing Wikidata pages for faculty at Texas State University
- Embracing identity management principles
 - Empowering communities to create own items
 - Moving toward stable identifiers (rather than relying on unique headings)



Reassessing effort put into siloed records

Experimentation with creating basic MARC authority records (NACO-lite)

Preparatory steps for Faculty Authors

- Created spreadsheet with faculty that already:
 - Had authority records and/or
 - Had Wikidata records
- Setup structure and Wikidata items for all campus departments so it would be available for various projects through batch tools



Doing our part to increase visibility

Researchers outline lessons to be learned from ongoing COVID-19 pandemic

The severity of the ongoing worldwide pandemic has prompted international researchers to warn that COVID-19 could be the first of many novel diseases infecting the human population and call for nations to shift from a reactionary strategy to one of prevention before the inevitable emergence of other zoonotic diseases.

The essay was written in part by Ivan Castro-Arellano, an associate professor in the Department of Biology at Texas State University. Their findings, "Tackling zoonoses in a crowded world: Lessons to be learned from the COVID-19 pandemic," are published in the journal *Acta Tropica* (www.sciencedirect.com/science/article/pii/S0001706X20316934).

Zoonosis describes diseases that can be transmitted to humans from animals.



Progress in faculty pages

- Met goal of 100 items in April: continuing to add more.
- Credit also to music cataloger who jumped in and created quite a few entries, both manually and through batch editing tools
- Next step: Investigating semi-automatic batch processes?



University Archives Oral History Project

- Why oral histories?
 - Demographic data in several places, spreadsheets (not publicly available), website, or PDF finding aid (not easily searched)
 - Creating linked data to point people to these interviews on our website, helps us connect to our collections and finding aids
- Idea of Notability
 - https://www.wikidata.org/wiki/Wikidata:Notability
 - Has to meet one of three criteria:
 - 2. It refers to an instance of a clearly identifiable conceptual or material entity. The entity must be notable, in the sense that it can be described using serious and publicly available references.



has works in the collection (P6379)

collection that has works of this person or organisation (use archive location P485 for the archives)
works in collection | has works in the collection(s) | work in collection | has work in the collection | museum housing this person's work

- Using has works in collection (P6379) for connection to oral history collection, but added archives at (P485), if had full finding aid at Txstate or another institution.

How it started

Surveyed to see what was already in Wikipedia/data, and other authorities.
 Also collected links.

- 3 out of 70 already had Wikidata entries, concentrating on new entries.
- Looked at <u>Stanford Libraries' project</u> to get ideas for properties
 - See <u>Wikidata:WikiProject PCC Wikidata Pilot/Texas State University Libraries</u> for properties included.



The work continues...

- Began to compile data on our participants, starting with our master oral history spreadsheet
 - Biographical sheets interviewees filled out, the interview itself, FindaGrave, obituaries, other institutions finding aids, LC authority records, SNAC records...
- Minimums vs how far down the rabbit hole do you want to go?
 - Example: <u>Piper Professor Award</u>
 - To create one record, had to create two more:
 - Minnie Stevens Piper Foundation
 - Minnie Stevens Piper
 - What information is actually useful in creating links?



Bulk entry tools

- Used Quickstatements and OpenRefine to create new entries in Wikidata
 - Manually did edits to existing records even though these bulk entries tools do allow for editing and adding to existing entries
- Quickstatements needed property and Q identifiers to work, time consuming with the varying data I had, was more useful with entries like university departments which only varied a little
- OpenRefine allowed me to use my data collection spreadsheet and 'reconcile' against existing properties

Guidelines for Editing Individual Records

- Collections are currently only being approached as an individual's archives
 - Ex. Antone's: Home of the Blues Collection
 - All edits are manual
 - Adding additional relevant biographical data, such as "Awards received" and other readily available information
 - Accessing additional resources when creating New items
 - Restricted from referencing Wikipedia and personal websites



Progress in Wittliff Archives Project

- Of the 152 listed Archives, 70 have been edited and 13 created
 - Leaving 69 to be reviewed
- Currently researching adding images to WikiCommons for use in Wikidata
- Google search of name with "archives" consistently brings Wittliff archives as top hits (Rick Riordan was #3, Sandra Cisneros was #1)

- Five journals currently published in our institutional repository (Digital Collections)
 - Electronic Journal of Differential Equations
 - Journal of College Academic Support Programs
 - Journal of Research on Women and Gender
 - Journal of Texas Music History
 - Texas State Undergraduate Research Journal
 - World History Review Journal
- Goal is to add or enhance any existing records in Wikidata
- Status: Done!

Further Considerations & Avenues

- Investigating adding citations to Wikidata
 - Book titles from faculty authors
 - Articles from digital journals to Wikidata
- Assessment of Wikidata work
- Developing best practices from pilot
- Link changes for finding aids
- Editing in Wikipedia
- Opportunity for increased visibility of EDI-related entities?



Addressing questions of sustainability

- Can be difficult to find time in existing workflow
 - Side project status
- Data maintenance keeping up with changes
- However, library silo systems aren't sustainable and also relatively invisible. What makes the most sense to put our efforts toward?
- Wikidata exposes our data to the public and other can build upon it, breaking down silos. It's what makes Wikidata a good resource.
 - What we add just might make a difference.
