



Public Administration deals with the stewardship and implementation of the products of a living democracy



Democracy that is organic, living, evolving, connected to political systems and not connected (creative, participatory)

It is most difficult to hold to our **political democracy** and to make it in any sense a social expression and not a mere governmental contrivance, unless we take pains to keep common ground in our **human experiences**. Addams *Democracy and Social Ethics* 1902

Problems with Negative Definition




- 1. Shifts focus from peace to violence.
- 2. Focuses on a short run end state.
- 3. Divorced from the dynamics of relationships.
- 4. Shifts attention away from underlying causes of violent conflict.




Positive Peace

- Nonviolent and creative conflict transformation.
- Uneven long run focus.
- The fabric of the kind of society to which we aspire.
- Integrity, wholeness and well-being that arise from justice.
- Humanity toward others.
- Openness to a widely conceived social claim.
