
LNET

If you would like to search the various on-line library catalogs to determine the availability of a title while you are at a terminal in your office or home without having to go to the library, then you need to know about LNET.

LNET, short for Library Network, is a command that allows the user to easily access on-line library catalogs at a variety of Texas universities through THENet (Texas Higher Education Network), including our own on-line catalog of the Albert B. Alkek Library. LNET is a menu driven program that is now available as a GADGETS command. If you are already a GADGETS user, simply type LNET at the dollar prompt.

\$ LNET <CR>

If you are not currently a GADGETS user (you have not defined GADGETS commands) and would like to do so, type the GADGETS command at the dollar prompt and choose selection 3. Note that you only need to do this one time. Once you are a "GADGETS user" you need not repeat the procedure below.

\$ GADGETS <CR>
GADGETS MENU DISPLAYS
3 <CR>

Type LNET at the dollar prompt:

\$ LNET <CR>

Please Enter Your Choice and Press RETURN:

To go to the on-line catalog of your choice enter the code and hit return. Since each catalog may operate differently, one should carefully follow system instructions to properly exit from selected on-line catalog (See GHELP LNET for further explanations).

\$ GHELP LNET <CR>

Although only selected libraries on LNET are presently listed, other names will be added when SWT has direct access to INTERNet.
